Dunedin Rhododendron Society, Torridon Street, Opoho

Wylde Willow Garden

A large country garden with everything (stream, pond, heritage roses, trees, rhododendrons and perennials), which evolved around Abbotsford Creek. Rated of National Significance by NZ Gardens Trust. Entry \$7.
